### Keynote:

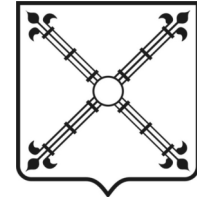
*What living as disciples of Jesus might look like for another 50 years*

## Cause for Celebration

In September of 1963, a group gathered to discuss the desire to make a new church community in the growing Williamsburg area. Diverse people came together to commit themselves to establishing a new church plant, as part of the ministry of the Diocese of Southern Virginia, that would be racially integrated. From the first, the community decided to be centered on the Eucharist and be committed to serving needs in the community.

The core group that helped plant St. Martin's was a diverse mix of people from various denominations, Episcopalians new to the area, and people from Bruton Parish Church, some of whom remained after the church was established and some of whom returned to their home church after their task was faithfully completed. All of this was made possible by the work of God through the material, spiritual and physical support of founding members and the diocese.

Unbelievably to some of the founding members, St. Martin's Church approaches the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its beginning this year. We hope you will celebrate with us during one or more of our anniversary events (*center panel*). It's always been a primary value for us to be a church that's *...out in the community* and which is *...part of the community*. Thus, we hope to celebrate *...as a community*.
